As we approach the 30th Anniversary of the International Year of the Family, the upcoming global conference will explore critical topics impacting families, focusing on the Four Megatrends, shaping the future of families. These include technological advancements, demographic shifts, climate change, international migration, and urbanization. The event will examine their effects on family dynamics and propose practical solutions.



Youth Summit will empower future society leaders by fostering innovation and intergenerational knowledge exchange. Young participants will share ideas for shaping the future of families through roundtables and interactive discussions. A vibrant community space will offer workshops, technological showcases, and networking opportunities for over 2,000 delegates, enabling them to connect with global experts and collaborate on strategies. The Family Playground will provide educational and fun activities for children and families, reinforcing the event's commitment to family engagement.


