Updates from the NGO Liaison Unit



Pact for the Future

On 22 September at the Summit of the Future in New York, world leaders adopted the <u>Pact</u> <u>for the Future</u>, an inter-governmentally negotiated, action-oriented document that includes a <u>Global Digital Compact</u> and a <u>Declaration on Future Generations</u>. The Pact covers a broad range of themes including peace and security, sustainable development, climate change, digital cooperation, human rights, gender, youth and future generations, and the transformation of global governance. It includes many references to partnerships with stakeholders, in particular civil society institutions and NGOs, and the promotion of a whole-of-society approach. Member States also decided to facilitate more structured, meaningful and inclusive engagement of NGOs in consultative status with the ECOSOC in the activities of the Council.

Participation in UN meetings and access to the Palais des Nations

NGOs wishing to attend UN meetings must first complete their annual accreditation with UNOG as per established <u>rules and procedure</u>. Specific registrations for events such as the ongoing Human Rights Council session have to be made online through <u>Indico</u>. The NGO Liaison Unit will continue to do its utmost to process the accreditation requests as quickly as possible, but delays can be expected during peak periods. Kindly plan accordingly.

We would like to remind you that enhanced measures are in place to reduce the time needed to <u>access</u> the Palais des Nations, including designated entry lanes for NGOs **at both Peace and Pregny gates**, the use of digital badges and the recent installation of state-of-the-art screening technology at the Pregny pavilion.

Finally, we would like to remind you that while the <u>iCSO database</u> is still down due to technical disruptions, the following **interim accreditation procedure** should be followed to request grounds passes at UNOG:

- A formal designation letter should be sent by email to the NGO Liaison Unit at <u>unog.ngo@un.org</u> with a copy of the passport bearing the signature of the person signing the letter.
- Requests for temporary grounds passes must indicate the start and end date of the pass and requests for Main representatives must indicate if the Main representative is granted with accrediting rights.

Annual report of the UN Secretary-General

If you have not yet seen it, check <u>Resolve: Report of the Secretary-General on the Work of the Organization 2024</u>. It is available in the 6 UN official languages and in 2 accessibility formats (e-books and Easy-to-Read), in line with the UN <u>Disability Inclusion Strategy</u>. The report presents how the UN Secretariat has translated resources into results over the course of the past year.

The Committee will also consider the following States for the lists of issues in absence of a report: Lesotho, Seychelles, and Togo. 
Committee on the Elimination of Discrimination against Women (CEDAW)

The 89th session of the CEDAW will take place from 7 to 25 October and is considering the following States: Lao People's Democratic Republic, Saudi Arabia, New Zealand, Chile, Canada, Japan, Cuba, and Benin. Human Rights Committee (CCPR)

The 142nd session of the CCPR will take place from 14 October to 7 November in Palais Wilson, Ground Floor Conference Room, and is considering the following countries: Ecuador, France, Greece, Iceland, Pakistan and Turkey. The Committee will also adopt list of issues on Latvia and list of issues prior to reporting on Benin, Cameroon, Monaco, Poland, Slovenia, and South Africa.
