# **Updates from the NGO Liaison Unit**



# UN liquidity crisis & cost of meetings at the Palais des Nations

On 17 February, the Director-General of UNOG held her annual meeting with accredited NGOs in Geneva, during which she briefed representatives on the ongoing liquidity challenges that the UN continues to face globally in 2025. She explained that this situation has an impact on mandates delivery, including in International Geneva. Measures are being considered to save the costs, and NGOs will be informed accordingly. The Director-General also reminded that pending a decision from the General Assembly on hybrid meeting modalities, all intergovernmental calendar meetings will be held in person. For non-calendar meetings, including meetings organized by NGOs, the cost of hybrid component increased in 2025 due to a general increase in the price of secure platforms used by the UN. ## **UNOG Language Training Programme**

Multilingualism is a core value of the United Nations. In Geneva, NGOs have access to language courses in the six UN official languages: Arabic, Chinese, English, French, Russian and Spanish. # **ECOSOC Committee on Non-Governmental Organizations**

The first 2025 session of the NGO Committee took place from 20 January to 11 February and concluded its session with the following recommendations:

- Out of the 536 applications for consultative status, the Committee recommended 148 and deferred 356 applications for further consideration at its next regular session.
- 31 applications were closed without prejudice after the NGOs in questions failed to respond to queries by the deadline of two business days.
- The Committee took note of five requests for a change of name.
- It also had before it 631 quadrennial reports, of which it took note of 483.

# **Committee on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (CRPD)**

The 32<sup>nd</sup> session of the <u>CRPD</u> will take place from 3 to 21 March and will consider the following states: Tuvalu, Dominican Republic, Viet Nam, Canada, European Union and Palau. The Committee will hold its 20<sup>th</sup> Pre-Sessional Working Group from 24 to 28 March 2025 and will consider the following State reports during the session: Armenia, Egypt, Monaco, Mozambique, Namibia, Nigeria, Republic of Moldova, Sierra Leone. #### 5th UN Ocean Forum


#### **Committee on Enforced Disappearances (CED)**
