# **Updates from the NGO Liaison Unit**



# Update on the ongoing liquidity challenges

In line with such measures across the UN Secretariat, the UN Secretary-General has requested UNOG to achieve significant savings, while continuing to fulfil its core mandated activities. The Office has been implementing <u>cash conservation measures</u> for some time, including closing several office buildings at the Palais, that allowed UNOG to maintain operational sustainability, while ensuring service delivery and supporting the intergovernmental processes of the Organization in Geneva. Some additional measures will take effect as of today and remain in force until further notice, including:

• Access to Palais des Nations: the operating hours of the access points (gates) to the Palais will continue to follow the reduced times of 8 a.m. to 7 p.m. on working days. The campus will continue to be closed on weekends and UN holidays.

- Official meetings: mandated meetings have absolute priority and, in line with General Assembly resolution 56/242, time slots of standard three-hour duration within official working hours (from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. and 3 p.m. to 6 p.m.) for meetings with conference services will be strictly applied.
- Side events and special events can take place only during regular working hours, unless organizers cover the extra costs incurred for events taking place outside of working hours.
- Lunchtime events in conference rooms can be accommodated only on a fully selfservice basis and in automatic sound mode. UNOG staff will not be in a position to provide technical or other assistance.
- Meetings coverage, press, broadcast and webcast services: there will be limited or no
  written coverage of some meetings, particularly the main sessions of the Human Rights
  Council as well as the intersessional meetings. There will also be some limitations to the
  full English and French press coverage of meetings.

If the situation worsens, further measures may become necessary later this year.


#### **Committee on the Elimination of Racial Discrimination (CERD)**
