Updates from the NGO Liaison Unit



Reminder of the ongoing UN liquidity challenges

UNOG has been implementing <u>cash conservation measures</u> for some time, including closing several office buildings at the Palais, which have allowed UNOG to maintain operational sustainability while ensuring service delivery and supporting the intergovernmental processes of the Organization in Geneva.

Quadrennial reports

We wish to remind you that, under ECOSOC resolution 1996/31, NGOs in general and special consultative status with the ECOSOC must submit to the NGO Committee every 4 years a quadrennial report, which includes information about contributions of the NGO to the work of the United Nations. Quadrennial reports are due for submission according to the schedule detailed in the following <u>website</u>. Please note that the reports for the period

2021-2024 are due by 1 June 2025 and must be submitted in English or French through this <u>online system</u>.

Committee against Torture and Other Cruel and Inhuman or Degrading Treatment or Punishment (CAT)

The 82nd session of the CAT is taking place until 2 May at Palais Wilson, First Floor Conference Room, and will consider the following states: Antigua and Barbuda, Armenia, Botswana, France, Iceland, Iraq, Kenya, Mauritius, Monaco, Montenegro, Pakistan, State of Palestine, Tajikistan, Turkmenistan, Ukraine and Uruguay. Universal Period Review (UPR)

The 49th session of the UPR is taking place until 9 May in Room VIII, Palais des Nations and is considering Armenia, Grenada, Guinea, Guinea-Bissau, Guyana, Kenya, Kiribati, Kuwait, Kyrgyzstan, Lao People's Democratic Republic, Lesotho, Spain, Sweden and Türkiye. 
World Health Assembly (WHA)
