Committee on Non-Governmental Organizations

The [Committee on NGOs](#) of the Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC) held its 2025 resumed session, from 19 - 23 and 28 - 29 May and 5 June. It recommended 170 applications for consultative status, deferred 381 for further consideration at its regular session in 2026 and closed consideration of 63 without prejudice. The Committee took

note of 8 requests for a change of name. It also had before it 555 quadrennial reports, of which it took note of 401. The full report will soon be available [here](#).

The [NGO Branch](#) in New York supports the work of the Committee on NGOs, the intergovernmental body responsible for granting consultative status with ECOSOC to NGOs.

Committee on the Elimination of Discrimination against Women (CEDAW)

The 91st session of the CEDAW is taking place until 4 July at the Palais des Nations, in Room XXIII, and will consider the following States: Afghanistan, Chad, Fiji, Ireland, Mexico, San Marino, Solomon Islands, Thailand and Tuvalu. More information is available [here](#).

The 59th session of the HRC is taking place until 11 July at the Palais des Nations, in Room XX. NGOs with ECOSOC status accredited at UNOG may participate as observers. 
Committee on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (CRPD)

The goal of the Beyond Lab is to make sustainability a way of life by influencing policies and decision-making in an inclusive, intergenerationally equitable way.
